SESSION OVERVIEW

Our third session together will help connect everything we've learned in session one and two and how even with the best of intentions, biases that seep into the public health space derailed early efforts toward universal healthcare in the U.S. and contributed to today's racial health disparities. From the resistance to equitable policy in the early 20th century to the role of racial pseudoscience that directly led to the legacy of experiments like Tuskegee, we'll examine the forks in the road where intersectional health justice was possible but denied. We'll also explore how these choices continue to shape access, trust, and care in marginalized communities today.
